

Flagstaff Academy Summer Reading Challenge 2011

To encourage reading at home this summer, we are challenging our students to read the suggested number of minutes for their grade level by the end of summer vacation. Each child will be eligible to receive a certificate and award for meeting the reading goal for his or her grade.

Incoming kindergarteners through incoming eighth grade students are able to participate. Incoming kindergarteners can read with their parents or have their parents read to them. All other students need to generally read independently by themselves.

Your children will need to keep a log of books and minutes read. The log will include the title, author, and the number of minutes read in each book. Students may only use a book once, even if they read it more than once during the summer. Students are encouraged to read books at their reading level, which may be above or below their grade level.

Completed sheets are to be turned in to teachers during the first week of school. Copy the log before you fill it in if you think you will need additional sheets. We hope that all of you will participate in this challenge because continued reading during vacation will increase fluency, comprehension, and vocabulary growth next fall.
